According to senior medical student Laura Mathis, Dr. Logan showed slides from his many medical mission trips to Honduras and Kenya. He discussed his team's efforts, providing basic medical care and building structures in Nuevo Paraiso and Pedro Alta. The team provided soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, anti-parasitics, and a one-year supply of vitamins for all the patients who were seen. The most frequent dermatologic conditions that he treated were skin cancer, eczema, psoriasis, and serious fungal and bacterial infections. A briefquestion-and answer period followed the lecture.
